I can talk about how Christians believe our world was created.  I can recall Bible stories I have read about how the world was created.  I can talk about how our world can be harmed.  I can give some ideas for how we can look after our world.  I can recall that the Bible is made up of two parts – The Old Testament and The New Testament.	I can talk about the origins of the Hindu religion.  I can say what Diwali is and recall ways it is celebrated by Hindus.  I can explain the significance of light in the Jewish religion and link to my learning about Hanukkah.  I can say why a Menorah is important to Jewish people.  I can explain the significance of light in the Christian religion, making explicit references to the parts of the Christingle.	I can talk about what makes a place special and how people may feel when they are in a special place.  I can name special places for Jews, Muslims, Sikhs, Hindus and Buddhists.  I can discuss the symbols found in a Church and explain why these are special to Christians.  I can recall the Bible story of John the Baptist and link this to my learning about a Baptism ceremony.  I can confidently recall the Easter Story and its significance for Christians.	I can talk about who I am and the different communities I belong to.  I can recall the disciples of Jesus and link this learning to talking about my own friends.  I can name people in the Bible who were friends to Jesus and how they showed their loyalty.  I can explain how Jesus was a friend to others.  I can explain what it is like to be a part of a family and recall Bible stories about families.
